### What is BPS Robotics



### Rules of the Teams:

- For most of them see "Code of Conduct" under forms.
- Grades must be C or better (homework, time mgt., character building)
  Parent help here.
- Parent monitored, Coach supported.
- Family first, School grades second, and team 3rd....
- Students do not have to be there everyday or all of the time. We give suggested time. The leaders give out tasks to each of the students. If accepted, the student is responsible to complete the task in a timely manner (per schedule). Leaders are responsible for monitoring schedule and progress.

# Bottom Line: (aka costs and fees)

- ▶ Club Fee \$40 is overdue if haven't paid; safety glasses, club t-shirt needed for KO
- & demonstrations, workshop supplies, tools, repair costs.
- FRC Team Fee \$450-\$500 due the week of January 6th; Team shirt, Team jacket, tools, supplies, lunches at competitions. Travel to championships and hotels are extra.
- Financial Aid/Scholarships + payment schedules see Coach Blodgett or Mr. Hendel. But extra participation in fundraising mandatory even if paying full amount in payments.
- TRAVEL IS OPTIONAL:
- District Championship trip will cost this year. Approximately \$500 pp.
- World Championship trip \$1500 \$1700 due April 6 (non-refundable air fare, hotel, food, transportation, sightseeing, Chaperone and Mentor contribution).
- Travel cost may change depending on what we can coordinate/get.

- Why are the travel cost higher than you can get yourselves? Travel costs also cover competition cost, transportation of tools an pit, mentors and coaches, food for Chaperones, airfare or ground transportation, and sight seeing.
